WARNING

- How does the relationship between the Crane and the Wolf evolve throughout the story?
- What does the Crane's dedication to her task say about her character?
- In what ways do the secondary characters contribute to the main narrative?
- Who do you relate to most and why? Opal, Carmen or Boffo?.
- How to Opal, Boffo and Carmen's backgrounds affect what they do in the kitchen for the Wolf?
- Why are Opal, Carmen and Boffo driven to compete in this competition?
- Do the bakers backgrounds affect how easy their job is in the kitchen?
- Discuss the risks and benefits the crane faces in helping the wolf. How does her decision reflect her priorities?
- How does the fable illustrate the concept of reciprocity? Is the wolf's lack of gratitude surprising?
- Explore the symbolism behind the wolf's sharp teeth and the crane's long neck. What do these physical attributes represent?
- Compare this fable to real-life situations where people help others without expecting anything in return.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Creative Writing:

Encourage participants to write alternative endings or additional scenes for the fable. How might the story change if the characters made different choices?

Role-Playing:

Act out scenes from the fable. Participants can take on the roles of the wolf, the crane, and other forest animals. Explore dialogue and emotions.

Debate:

Divide participants into teams and debate ethical questions related to the fable. For example: Should the crane have helped the wolf despite the risks? Is reciprocity essential in relationships?

Artistic Expression:

Have each member of the group create one of the dishes prepared for the Wolf and share your culinary creations for a literary feast.

Interactive Storytelling:

Collaboratively build a new fable based on the same theme. Participants take turns adding elements to the story, emphasizing teamwork and creativity.
